At 1354 hours, E/A again appeared in the vicinity of our Wing and P-47's were reported to have dived down upon them. Immediately after our escort had left for the interception of the enemy fighters, a wave of fifteen (15) FW 190's grey in color and with a fairly large red square painted on the side of the fuselage made a head-on attack from a great distance away, coming in slightly below and flying directly through and between our Lead and Low Squadrons. These A/C broke to the right and progressed again ahead of the formation in trail. As they were continuing across the front of our formation, three (3) additional FW 190's using the latter as a screen, suddenly broke beneath them and dove again into our Low Squadron. During this attack, the Group Leader and six (6) additional aircraft of our Low Squadron were shot down.

Destructive action began in the leading element of the Low Squadron, and in clearing the formation and the explosion of our A/C that immediately followed, the Squadron was somewhat scattered and were successfully destroyed by FW 190's, continuing to come through in staggered trail.

Fifteen (15) additional long-nosed FW 190's and ME 109's attacked from slightly below between 11 and 12 O'Clock, passing through the area occupied by our Low Squadron. Between the times of 1354 and 1359 hours, it appears that no fighter escort was covering this Group and that at about 1359 $\frac{1}{2}$ hours, a Group of P-51's showed up carrying dual belly gasoline tanks which were immediately dropped upon attacking the enemy. No further interceptions were made from this point on.

The above enemy action is estimated to have lasted only from 1354 to 1357 hours.

The American Charge d'Affaires a.i. at Bern forwarded on 16 December 1944 to the War Department a copy of a letter addressed on 14 August 1944, to the Swiss Legation at Berlin by the Senior American Officer at the Central Compound of Stalag Luft III in Germany, enclosing a report prepared on the basis of information received from prisoners of war at that camp regarding members of the United States Army Air Force who are known to be dead.

The letter referred to above dated 14 August 1944 reads in part as follows:

"In order to help . . . you verify reports you have on hand, a very careful and conscientious effort has been made to obtain all the names of the dead members of airplane crews represented in the Center Compound. Each crew which has a representative in this Compound has been interrogated, and when it was ascertained without a doubt that some member had been killed his name, rank and circumstances leading to his death have been recorded, and is forwarded with this letter in the hope that it will shed some light on doubtful and unknown cases. In some cases it was impossible for me to obtain enough information on the dead man to get his full name. In those cases we have given the name, rank, and serial number of a member of his crew, (the one who personally saw the dead man) and also the date, and place where the accident occurred"


