

This was the first time I had every flower with this crew - in fact, it wasn't a regular crew. As a consequence I was not familian with any one of them, except Adams, the tail-gunner, who I knew slightly.

The plane was hit by flake and immediately dropped out of formation. It was on fire. Crew members in the nose bailed out first and the others from the weist back after the plane exploded. So we didn't land together and I had ho shance to observe what happened to the others.


