Last Minute Notes for Attending the Reunion in October

This is the final (short) newsletter before our 21st Reunion on 2-5 Oct 08. Please be sure you have made your hotel reservations by calling the Holiday Inn Fairborn at 937-426-7800, and be sure to tell them that you are with the 384th Bomb Group to get our special rate of \$89 per night. Also, if you require transportation from the airport, let Kris Davis (937-431-4603) know your flight number and time of arrival at the Dayton Airport. She will arrange transportation and it will only cost you \$15 per person. Some of you have made hotel reservations, but have not paid your reunion fees and others have paid the fees, but have not made hotel reservations... please confirm both. If you are arriving on Friday, 3 Oct, be sure to arrive at the hotel in plenty of time to make the bus departure at 2:30 pm, which is when we leave for a tour of the Presidential aircraft and Huffman Prairie Interpretive Center before going on to the Air Force Museum. Please do not be late, but if you are, please drive or catch a cab to the AF Museum to be there at 6 pm. If you plan to rent a car upon your arrival, you may want to look into flying into Columbus and driving to Dayton, because some airlines have better fares into Columbus than Dayton. It is only an hour's drive from Columbus to Dayton and it's all interstate. What to wear?? The average Oct temperature in Dayton is: low of 44 and high of 82, with less than 3 inches of rain for the month. They are forecasting a colder winter here this year, so I would think the temps might be around the mid 60s and cooler in the evenings, so bring jackets and sweaters. Bring your cameras, because the Ohio colors are wonderful at that time of the year, and besides, you will want to capture photos of all our 384th family! There are plenty of eateries within walking distance of our hotel, so you needn't worry about having to eat all of your meals in the hotel. 
