The Future of Our Group

Before and during the last reunion, 18-21 October, there was much discussion among board members about the future of our organization. Under current law, we are a 501(c)(3) non-profit veterans group, and we are registered in the state of Ohio with Carol Alfter as the Treasurer. Our membership is currently overwhelmingly NexGen (a very good thing!), but with fewer and fewer 384th Bomb Group veterans. Sadly, the day will come when our last 384th BG veteran will pass from us. When that happens, the Group would not be able to comply with the law and we would cease to exist.

After discussing this at length at our board of directors meeting in Dayton during the 2018 reunion, we voted unanimously that we reorganize as a non-profit historical association. We feel this is a very positive thing to do for the future of the Group, so that we are not forced to close forever. We believe that the 384th Bomb Group has a noble mission to support the legacy of our 384th Bomb Group veterans, and that we have stalwart, active NexGen members to support that goal into the future. We believe we have real value for present and future generations that want to preserve this legacy. Other bomb groups have successfully transitioned from veterans associations to historical associations.

But we also need to poll our membership to verify that we have support for a reorganization and to answer the question, "shall we continue as an association?"

We have some options, which include: 1) disband/dissolve now, or 2) continue until our last veteran is gone and close shop, or 3) reorganize as a non-profit historical association. If the decision is to disband, the 384th Bomb Group goes away forever. So, we will soon be sending out a ballot to each member to determine the wishes

of the membership. So, please return your ballot in the provided self-addressed stamped envelope. If the majority (50.1%) is in agreement with the board's vote to reorganize as an association, we would need to hire a lawyer to get us through the legal changes, properly transfer monies to the new organization and reform as the 384th Bomb Group Association with non-profit status. Carol Alfter is going to pass Treasurer duties on to someone else and we would like to have this process completed before the new Treasurer takes over.

The ballot will be sent with the Dues Payment mailing with a self-addressed stamped envelope. Use the provided SASE to vote for the Group's future. We need all members to participate in this vote for this transition. Please reply as soon as possible so the vote can be verified and we can decide the Group's future.

The tour does not include flight tickets, which must be arranged separately. The return to Grafton Underwood should make for some great memories. The tour will include a visit to the Cambridge American Cemetary, entrance to the Imperial War Museum at Duxford and the Duxford Airshow. The air show always includes a flyby of B-17G "Sally B" which is based in England.

384th Junket XI Itinerary

The following is the first draft of the trip itinerary for September 19-24, 2019. It's based on a minimum of 30 people participating. Trip information will be included with the Dues Mailing.

Initial security deposit is \$300 per person. Tour cost is \$1525.00 per/person double occupancy.

Tour price includes:

- 5 nights' accommodation on a dinner, bed and breakfast at the Doubletree by Hilton Cambridge Belfry including Welcome and Farewell Dinner.
- Executive coach travel throughout.
- Visits as per the itinerary including Grafton Underwood Airfield and airfields in
- Entrance to Imperial War Museum Duxford including the Air Show, Lunch and Gold experience to include use of marquee, seating, access to flight line, and
- Traditional afternoon tea at the Lavenham Swan.
- Buffet lunch at Grafton Underwood Village Hall or similar.
- Time to visit Boughton House if desired.
- Visit to Cambridge American Cemetery and Memorial with Service of Remembrance.
- Services of an Arena Travel Tour Manager who will accompany the tour throughout.


