SUBJECT: Amended Instructions Concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War, to Include Evaders of Capture in Enemy or Enemy-Occupied Territory and Internees in Neutral Countries.

- 1. Publication or communication to any unauthorized persons of experiences of escape or evasion from enemy-occupied territory, internment in aneutral country, or release from internment not only FURNISHES USEFUL INFORMATION TO THE ENEMY but also JEOPARDIZES FUTURE ESCAPES, EVASIONS AND RELEASES.
- Personnel will not, unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, publish in any form whatever or communicate either directly, or indirectly, to the press, radio or an unauthorized person any account of escape or evasion of capture from enemy or enemy-occupied territory, or internment in a neutral country either before or after repatriation. They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.
- Evaders.escapees, or internees shall not be interrogated on the circumstances of their experiences in escape, evasion or internment except by the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations. In allied or neutral countries, American Military Attaches are authorized to interrogate on escape, evasion and internment matters.
- 4. Should the services of escaped prisoners of war, evaders, or internees be deemed necessary for lecturing and briefing, such services will be under the direct supervision of the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations.
- Commanding Officers will be responsible for instructing all evaders, escapees, and internees in the provisions of this directive which supersedes letter, AG 383.6 (5 Nov 42) OB-S-B-M, 7 November 1942, subject: Instructions concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War and other previous instructions on this subject.

#### RESTRICTED

- 1. Because disclosures of information regarding evasion from capture, escape, details of imprisonment, release from internment, and repatriation have been made, the lives and services of fellow soldiers and those who help them have been lost or endangered. All information which you possess on these subjects, including the experiences of others as well as your own, briefings and equipment for evasion and escape, and preparations and other activities in connection therewith, constitutes MILITARY INFORMATION which is classified SECRET by the War Department.
- 2. You will therefore disclose no information whatever, beyond the fact of your return to duty from "missing in action" or "prisoner of war" or "internment", to anyone except the following military officials:
  - a. The first Military Attache to whom you report;
  - b. An officer designated by the Commanding General of an overseas Theatre of Operations;
  - c. The Prisoner of War Branch, MIS, Washington, D.C., the interrogating agency designated by the A/C of S, G-2, War Department General Staff:
  - d. Certain other officers holding written authority from the A/C of S, G-2, WDGS, to interrogate you.
- 3. You will particularly guard against disclosure of SECRET information to relatives, friends, representatives of the press and radio, and military officials, except as noted in a, b, c and d above.
- 4. In order to protect yourself against disciplinary action, any question involving publicity must be referred BY YOU PERSONALLY to the A/C of S, G-2, WDGS, Washington, D.C.

#### SUPERBORNING OF THE PROPERTY OF THE CERTIFICATE AND ADDRESS OF THE PROPERTY OF

I certify that I have read and fully understand all of the foregoing and the Directive of the Secretary of War, 6 Aug 43 (on the reverse side), and will at ALL TIMES hereafter comply fully therewith.

I understand that all information concerning escape, evasion from capture, activities and equipment in connection therewith, and details of imprisonment or release from internment, is SECRET and must not be disclosed to anyone except the military officials specifically designated. I further understand that disclosure to any other person will make me liable to disciplinary action for failure to safeguard MILITARY INFORMATION.

I realize that publicity concerning my experiences, by word of mouth or otherwise, will endanger the lives of many persons and therefore it is my duty to take all possible precautions to prevent it.

I was pilot of a B-17 shot down near JABOCKE, Relgium on 1 Dec 43. I was taken to BRUGES by GEORGE DE JANOCKHEERE, with whom I stayed 2 days. I was also helped by the brother-in-law of M. MERTZ, connected with the BELGIAN EMBASSY in LONDON, THEN I was taken to BRUSSELS, I stayed for 6 days. He made contact with the an organization. Then I went to the home of a blind woman "MME. JENNY", 10 Rue MERCELLES, BRUSS. Thence, on 21 Dec, to home of M. TROUIFF (cafe) in MOUSCRON. From here I was taken to TOURCOING, France, to the home of FERDINANT VANAERDEN, 27 BOUL. GAMBETTA. On 30 Dec I went to Paris, where I stayed with HENRI, orgin chief later arrested lu Gestapo, and with other orgin members known as MME CLAUDE, MME. JEANETTE, MME PERNANDEZ. I was then sent to JUVISY, staying with M. RICHERFEAU for 3 weeks. He lives across the street from the RR Station. Works for the SCNF Ry. Has 20 year-old daughter. I then went back to Paris and stayed with MME SIMONE PRUDHOMME, 3 Rue de JOURDAIN. I was there for 4 months. She is not an organization member. She was a wonderful helper, and deserves very great credit. I was well cared for also by René, a butcher of Rue du FAUSOURG du TEMPLE, just around the corner from BOUL de la VILLETTE, and another butcher, ROBERT, of MENIL MONTANT (has shop there). I made three trips from PARIS to the neighborhood of the spanish border, but was unable to negotiate a crossing, being twice stopped by Gestapo (?-RSF), so I decided to go to Switzerland. MME COLLETTE and MME ANNIE the former lived near Ste Augustine and the latter was supposed to have worked for Brit intelligence) took me to BEAUCOURT but on 6 May, but the guide whom we were supposed to meet had been arrested just previously, so we went back to Paris. I then took another trip to BEAUCOURT, This time with Sqt. ERNEST KING, whom I had mer in Paris. This time we contacted a priest who get guides who took us across the border. However Sgt. King was arrested by Germans on the way. + was I was interned as an escapee in Switzerland, and early in September

I managed to escape. I was helped by a Swiss named MAGNENET,
