On 13 April, I bailed out over BELGIUM and landed near SAMREE (Approx 4 mis NE of LAROCHE). I hid for two hours, then approached a young Belgian who brought a member of an underground organization to see me.

I was taken to the home of the local priest and then to a cabin in the woods. Here I found three Americans and four or five Belgian partizans. I was given civilian clothing and remained there three days.

At the end of that time, we started off in pairs. I went with a B-17 radio operator whose first name was THEODORE. We walked to ST HUBERT(14 mis SW of LAROCHE), and slept in a barn there overnight. Then we walked to BERTRIX(about 13 mis SW of ST HUBERT). THEODORE decided to return to SAMREE that afternoon, so I went en Alone.

On 21 April, made contact with another organization. We went to the home of the Phillips Radio dealer, and from there to the home of his parents at STE/CECILE. We were moved to a village about three kilos east, and remained there for three days. Then from ST MEDARD we went to a cave near HERBEUMONT. Here I met two other Americans, Sgt ROSKI and Lt KOWSINGER.

I was taken to ORGEO where we stayed with the ex-burgomaster for about ten days! He seemed to be very prominent in the organization.

Then I went to SUGNY where I stayed in a cavern first, then with Mme DURY. The organization chief here was named GILLETTE. We then went to MOUZAIVE where we spent five days with a young lady and her mother. They owned a tobacco farm.

From there, we returned to SUGNYwhere we remained for four days. We then stayed without on a farm with a man who said he was from ANVERS.

Fighting started up in this section, so we decided to go on to Switzerland. GILLETTE took us to SEDAN in France. There we stayed three days with a schoolteacher. Then we were brought to NANCY and taken on the train to the station before MONTBELIARD. We walked to BLAMONT and went to the home of a retired protestant pastor.

We were put in touch with a young man and the next day/he guided within a kilometer of the frontier. Is walked across the frontier to DAMVANT, and turned myself in to the Swiss police.

I was kept at PORRENTRUY for four days, then sent to BAD-LUSTORF for the remaining 17 days of quarantine. On 25 June, I was sent to GLION and I remained there until about 15 Sept, when about 40 of us were put on a train and taken to the border to be released. There American trucks met us and took us to ANNECY. I was flown to the UK from ANNECY on 29 Sept.

The White Ammy leader told me that our pilot, LT HERBERT T SWANSON, was killed when he attempted ancrash landing near SAMREE. He claimed that he had examined the dog tags. The top turret gunner, Sgt JAMES YOUNG was killed by enemy action before we left the plane.

 - d. Certain other officers holding written authority from the A/C of S, G-2, WDGS, to interrogate you.
- 3. You will particularly guard against disclosure of SECRET information to relatives, friends, representatives of the press and radio, and military officials, except as noted in a, b, c and d above.
- 4. In order to protect yourself against disciplinary action, any question involving publicity must be referred BY YOU PERSONALLY to the A/C of S, G-2, WDGS, Washington, D.C.

- 1. Publication or communication to any unauthorized persons of experiences of escape or evasion from enemy-occupied territory, internment in aneutral country, or release from internment not only FURNISHES USEFUL INFORMATION TO THE ENEMY but also JEOPARDIZES FUTURE ESCAPES, EVASIONS AND RELEASES.
- 2. Personnel will not, unless authorized by the Assistant Chief of Staff, 6-2, War Department General Staff, publish in any form whatever or communicate either directly, or indirectly, to the press, radio or an unauthorized person any account of escape or evasion of capture from enemy or enemy-occupied territory, or internment in a neutral country either before or after repatriation. They will be held strictly responsible for all statements contained in communications to friends which may subsequently be published in the press or otherwise.
- 3. Evaders.escapees, or internees shall not be interrogated on the circumstances of their experiences in escape, evasion or internment except by the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations. In allied or neutral countries, American Military Attaches are authorized to interrogate on escape, evasion and internment matters.
- 4. Should the services of escaped prisoners of war, evaders, or internees be deemed necessary for lecturing and briefing, such services will be under the direct supervision of the agency designated by the Assistant Chief of Staff, G-2, War Department General Staff, or the corresponding organization in overseas theaters of operations.
- 5. Commanding Officers will be responsible for instructing all evaders, escapees, and internees in the provisions of this directive which supersedes letter, AG 383.6 (5 Nov 42) OB-S-B-M, 7 November 1942, subject: Instructions concerning Publicity in Connection with Escaped Prisoners of War and other previous instructions on this subject.
