

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

Donr Mr and Mrs. Brescia:

I am writing you relative to the previous letter from this office in which you were regretfully informed that a Finding of Death had been made in the case of your son, Staff Sergeant Alfred J. Brescia, 12,127,755, Air Corps, and that the presumptive date of his death had been established as 10 October 1944.

Under the revised provisions of the Missing Persons Act, the War Department is empowered to establish an actual date of death and issue an official report of death in any case where the circumstances under which that person became missing in action lead to no other logical conclusion. Your son was a crew member aboard a B-17 aircraft which was lost on a combat mission to Anklam, Germany on 9 October 1943. The aircraft was last sighted in a badly damaged condition about fifty miles off the coast of Denmark and at that time was sustaining further enemy attack.

In view of this fact and the incolledge that more than three years have elapsed since he was rejorted missing in action, it may only be concluded that Sergeant Bruscia was killed in action on 9 October 1943 when his plane either crashed or was ditched in the North Sea at a point too far from land to permit rescue. The records of the War Department have been amended accordingly.

Pursuant to the provisions of Public Law 490, 77th Congress, 7 March 1942 as amended, official reports will now be issued by the War Department which will indicate the actual date of his death as that shown above. The issuance of this official Report of Death will not affect any payment or settlement of accounts which has been made on the basis of the Finding of Death.

My continued sympathy is with you in the great loss you have sustained.

The Board convened pursuant to par 2, SO No. 1, Head-quarters American Graves Registration Command, APO 757, U.S. Army, 2 January 1950, at the Astoria Hotel, Paris, France, on 23 FEB 1950. The purpose of the Board was to determine the non-recoverability status of certain casualties now under jurisdiction of this command.

The Roard reviewed report of investigation, statements of witnesses and other papers, contained in the files of American Graves Registration Command, EA, pertaining to the case of the following named casualty/casualties, the remains of which have not been recovered. 

casualties comprised part of the crew of aircraft B-17 F, 42-29814 which failed to return from a bombing mission to Anklam, Germany on 9 October 1943. Information contained in MACR #872 and "Casualty Clearance Plan", dated 11 October 1945, indicates that subject aircraft had been seriously damaged by enemy fighters and was last observed fifty (50) miles West of the Danish coast under attack by several enemy aircraft. There are no German Dulag records concerning subject aircraft and crew and no indications that the remains of any of the crew members were ever washed ashore and recovered from North Sea coastal areas in Denmark or Germany. This entire area has been repeatedly investigated in connection with the recovery of the remains of American deceased without disclosing any additional information concerning the subject casualties. Attempts to associate

unknown deceased recovered from coastal areas relevant to this case also met with negative results. It is logical to conclude that Lt. John T. INGLES, Lt. Harry M. PRATT, Lt. Charles L. RUMAN, Lt. Robert L. FISH, T/Sgt Clarence T. MORRISON, S/Sgt Lawrence W. Smith, Jr., S/Sgt John F. FARIEY, S/Sgt Alfred J. BRESCIA, S/Sgt Carl W. JANES and S/Sgt Charles A. SPAULDING were killed when the aircraft in which they were crew members crashed into the NORTH SEA, somewhere off the coast of Denmark, on 9 October 1943 and that their remains have never washed ashore and have not been recovered. The fact that there are no unknowns on record that may be associated with the subject casualties would tend to substantiate this conclusion: It is therefore recommended that this case be deemed Non-Recoverable.

Reference is made to: UQMG Forms 371; MACR #872; Casualty Clearance Flan, dated 11 October 1945 on file at the Office of the Quartermaster General Washington, D. C.

- 2. Every effort has been made to correlate this case with records in this headquarters pertaining to unknown deceased interred in U.S. Military Cemeteries and reported isolated burials. The results are negative.
- 3. It is recommended that the remains, based upon the above information and research, be declared Non-Recoverable.
