2. An amount not to exceed \$75 is allowed by the government toward actual interment expenses when final interment of the remains is in a private or civilian cemetery. No allowance is authorized toward interment expenses when interment is in a national or post cemetery.

3. The \$75 maximum allowance by the government toward interment expenses includes but is not limited to the payment of one or more of the following items: hearse hire from the railroad station to your home, the funeral home, church, cemetery, or any other place designated by you; vault; church services; newspaper notices; transportation for friends and relatives to and from cemetery; and the services of a funeral director.

4. Reimbursement by the government is made only to the person who paid from his personal funds the expenses of an incident to interment in a private or civilian cemetery. Receipted bills are not required to substantiate this claim. Any expenses over and above the \$75 maximum must be borne by the person who incurred or paid the additional expenses.

EXPLANATION OF PART B - NATIONAL OR POST CEMETERY

1. When the remains are delivered to you at government expense prior to burial in a national or post cemetery, you are responsible for all additional expenses necessary to deliver the remains from that point to the national or post cemetery grave site. 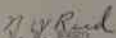

My dear Mr. Cook:

I am writing in reply to your kind letter of March 17th, and with further reference to my communication of March 8th, concerning your son, the late Sergeant Jack C. Cook.

The report mentioned in my letter has been received in this headquarters from the European Area and it states that Sergeant Cook was killed in action on February 3, 1945, while serving as a ball turret gunner on a B-17 (Flying Fortress) bomber which participated in a bombardment mission to Berlin, Germany. The bomber was damaged heavily by flak over the target area and was forced to ditch before reaching the English Coast. The crew had to swim for life rafts, and three of the crewmen did not reach any of the rafts. These three crew members were the pilot, Second Lieutenant Robert C. Long, the radio operator, Sergeant Fred A. Haki and your son. The bodies of your son and the pilot were recovered.

Lieutenant Long's and Sergeant Haki's emergency addressees are as follows:

The remainder of the crew were not reported as casualties and therefore their names and those of their emergency addressees are not given, since it might cause their families undue distress if they were advised of the accident.

This office has been advised by The Quartermaster General that a burial report concerning your son has been received, and we are requesting that official to forward such information to you as soon as it is practicable.

Again, I extend my deepest sympathy to you and other members of Sergeant Cook's family in your sorrow.
