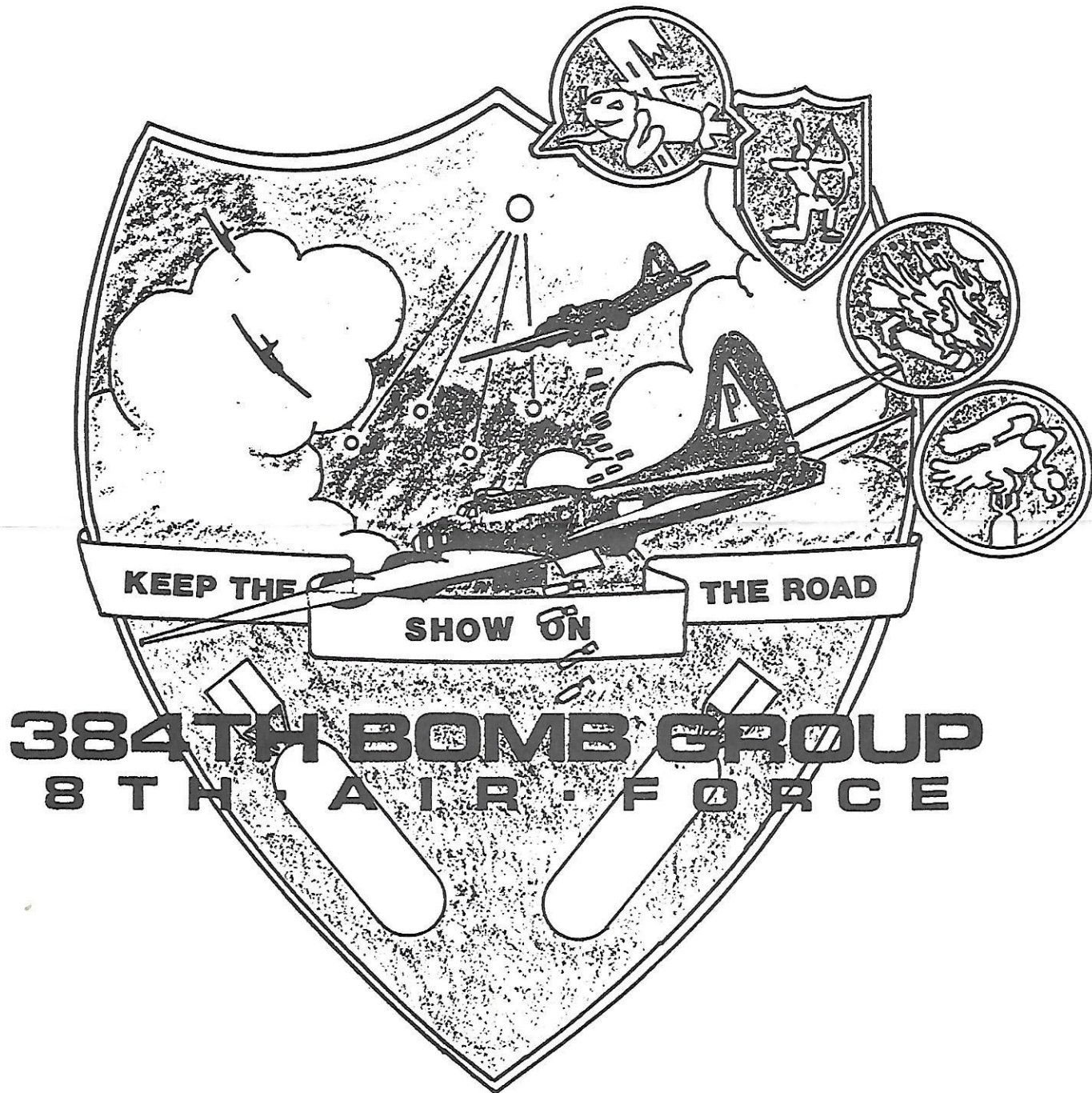

“KEEP THE SHOW ON THE ROAD”

50TH ANNIVERSARY REUNION NEWPORT BEACH, CALIFORNIA SEPTEMBER 10th-13th, 1992

It was 50 Years ago on December 1, 1942 that the 384th Bombardment Group (H) was activated. . . the early days of Wendover seem so far away. . . those Salt Flats of Utah. Who can forget them??? Then we went to Sioux City, Iowa where we were equipped with brand new B-17s', the Flying Fortress. We then began to prepare for our movement to England to become part of the 8th Air Force. . . the 41st Combat Wing. The ground Echelon sailed on May 27, 1943 from New York on the Queen Elizabeth. They arrived at Greenock on June 3rd and then travelled by train and lorry to Grafton Underwood where the Group's Aircraft had already arrived at Station 106 on May 27, 1943.

The initial strength of the Group at that time was 42 Aircraft. . . nine to each of the four Squadrons. . . the 544th, 545th, 546th, and the 547th. The remaining six Fortresses were spares. The B-17s' were flown over the Atlantic by the Squadron and Group Staff. One Aircraft ditched in the Atlantic and another was lost in a collision when approaching to land at Grafton-Underwood after a training flight.

A short period was allowed for the modification of the Aircraft for combat and for the Crews to be familiarized with the flying procedures in England. . . also to get familiar with combat conditions in Europe. Key personnel flew a combat mission with the 303rd Bombardment Group at Molesworth on June 13, 1943 to gain first hand experience.

Our operations started on June 22, 1943 and the rest is History. After only a month away from our final training in the United States we had half a dozen missions under our belt. . . tough missions that might have shaken a less determined Group. Those first weeks of combat gave the 384th the traditions that remained with us throughout the scores of missions that followed.

A Crew of a ditched Fortress in the North Sea, after 41 hours adrift, returned to the Base after being rescued. The Pilot had one simple statement for the interrogators. . . 'WE FLEW THE COURSE AS BRIEFED'.

Another tradition grew out of the Group's second mission. Major Seldon L. McMillen, the Group's Deputy Commander, was shot down on the Hamburg mission. He sent us a slogan from a Prisoner of War Camp that was to guide the 384th BG in the more fortunate months to come. It was the first voice heard from the wilderness of our lost Aircraft. . . the slogan was. . . 'KEEP THE SHOW ON THE ROAD'.

We have kept the Show on the Road. . . now 50 Years later we will have our 50TH ANNIVERSARY REUNION. We have lost a number of 384thers since we flew that first mission so many years ago, both Ground and Air Crew. Those of us who are still around do our best to. . . 'KEEP THE SHOW ON THE ROAD'.

We are hoping for a good turn out for this very SPECIAL REUNION as it will be the GOLDEN ANNIVERSARY of the BIRTH of the 384TH BOMBARDMENT GROUP(H). An event like this happens only once in a lifetime, in view of this, do not miss the opportunity to attend the 50TH ANNIVERSARY REUNION, which is scheduled for September 10-13, 1992 at Newport Beach/Irvine, California.

Lloyd Whitlow (CA), who is Chairman of the Reunion, and his fine Reunion Committee and the Board of Directors have worked very hard and have devoted a lot of their time to make the 50TH ANNIVERSARY REUNION one of our BEST! Another point to remember, each Committee Member, and the Members from the Board of Directors volunteer their services and they pay for their travel, hotels, etc. at their own expense. This is real dedication to your Organization and to show your appreciation for this exemplary service, one should make every effort to attend the 50TH ANNIVERSARY REUNION.

Now you ask, why Newport Beach, California. . . because the members of the 384th BG who attended the 12th Reunion at Wichita, Kansas voted for this site during the Business Meeting. Nashville, Tennessee came in second and San Diego, California third. The members with their vote, always have the final say as to where the Reunions shall be held.

HOTEL . . .

To accommodate our Reunions we need a hotel that has adequate facilities to handle all of our functions, etc. The other factors are the location and naturally a reasonable room rate. . . .

Our Hotel for the 50TH ANNIVERSARY REUNION will be the Irvine Marriott, 18000 Von Karman, Irvine, California, located in Koll Center, just off of I-405 Freeway. . . only a short distance from the John Wayne/Orange County Airport. . . only 15 minutes from the Pacific Ocean. The hotel offers complimentary shuttle service to and from the Airport. . . all Major Airlines serve the Airport.

The Marriott Hotel has 485 Guest Rooms; Restaurants and Lounges; Heated Indoor/Outdoor Swimming Pool; Health Club; 4 Tennis Courts, lighted for night play; and Golf available at a nearby 18 Hole Golf Course. They have 27 Meeting Rooms, which gives us a nice choice for our Registration Room and Memorabilia Room and Lounge. The Grand Ballroom will seat 900 people for a Dinner Dance.

The Room Rate for the Marriott Hotel will be \$62.00, plus tax, for a Single or a Double Room. The hotel fills our needs, the Annual Board of Directors Meeting was recently held at the Marriott and all agreed that we came up with an excellent choice for the 50TH ANNIVERSARY REUNION Hotel. There are also many restaurants near the hotel. . . the location is excellent!

The Hotel will furnish a Glen Miller Style Orchestra for a Dinner Dance on Saturday evening, August 15, 1992 for the entertainment of any 384thers, or others who plan to attend. MEMORIAL AVENUE OF TREES . . .

On Saturday, October 5, 1985, during Memorial Junket V, there was a Tree Planting Ceremony at Station 106,

Grafton Underwood, England and the members who attended the Junket planted Trees down either side of the old Runway, 6-24. There are 76 Trees planted down either side of this Runway. In Honor of our first Commanding Officer the Runway is named: Colonel Budd J. Peaslee Memorial Avenue. All 76 Trees on this Avenue have been purchased by members of the 384th Bomb Group and they are Dedicated in Memory or in Honor Of, a person selected by the Donor of each Tree.

Some time later, the Duke of Buccleugh had trees planted down the old Runway, 12-30, which also has 76 Trees planted down either side of the Runway. This Runway has been named: Colonel William E. Dolan Memorial Avenue, in Memory of "Pop" Dolan who was the only Staff Officer to serve the Group through the entire period.

There are still approximately 30 Trees still available on this Memorial Avenue of Trees. During Memorial Junket VI we Dedicated a Plaque, which is located on top of the Time Capsule at the Memorial Monument, which shows the Memorial Avenue of Trees. There are also two Plaques located in St. James the Apostle Church, Grafton-Underwood, which list the names of the Donor and to whom the Trees are Dedicated.

The PALACE STATION hotel buffet is popular with locals. It was also named the best buffet value in Las Vegas in a reader poll by the major Las Vegas newspaper.

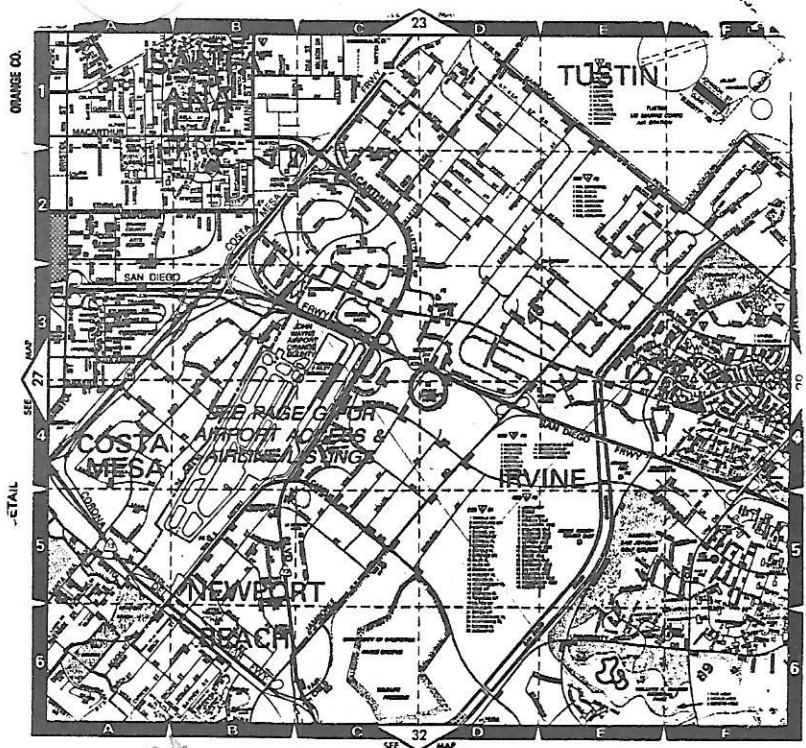

DIRECTIONS

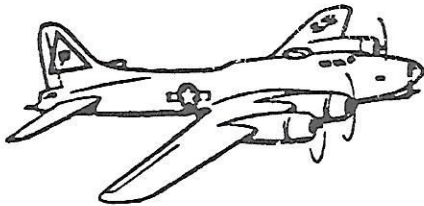
The Marriott Hotel is located at 18000 Von Karman Avenue, Irvine, California. If you are arriving to the 50th Anniversary Reunion by automobile you will find there is no Off-Ramp from the San Diego Freeway (I-405) for Von Karman.

To get to the Marriott Hotel, take either the San Diego Freeway Jamboree Road Off-Ramp and proceed south on Jamboree Road to Michelson Drive. At Michelson Drive, turn right and proceed to Von Karman, at Von Karman again turn right and proceed to the first Electric Signal, at the Signal turn right into Koll Center, and then a quick left turn to the Marriott Hotel. Or, take the San Diego Freeway MacArthur Boulevard Off-Ramp and proceed south by the John Wayne/Orange County Airport Terminal to Michelson Drive. At Michelson Drive turn left and proceed to Von Karman Avenue, at Von Karman turn left and proceed to the first Electric Signal, at the Signal turn right into the Koll Center, then a quick left turn to the Marriott Hotel.
