MEMORIAL JUNKET VIII MAY 5TH THRU MAY 8TH, 1995

50th has been a big number for the last few years ... in 1992 we celebrated the 50th Anniversary of the Birth of the 384th Bombardment Group(H) at the 50th Anniversary Reunion which was held at Irvine/Newport Beach, California. In 1993 we celebrated the 50th Anniversary of the Arrival of the 384th Bombardment Group(H) at Station 106, Grafton Underwood, England and the 50th Anniversary of the First Combat Mission flown by the Group with Memorial Junket VII. A few of us 384thers attended the 50th Anniversary of "D DAY," which took place at the Cambridge American Cemetery. These are now all history. The upcoming 50th Anniversary of "VE DAY" is probably the most important to all of us because it was the end of World War II in Europe. To celebrate this Historical Day we are planning Memorial Junket VIII.

To make the arrangements for the Hotel and Program for Memorial Junket VIII, Lloyd Whitlow made a trip to England during November 1994. The dates for Memorial Junket VIII will be May 5th thru May 8th, 1995. We will once again be headquartered at the Leicester Holiday Inn because it is the only hotel in the area that can accommodate a group of our size.

Memorial Junket VIII will open on Friday, May 5th with Registration during the afternoon. In the evening there will be a Reception and Briefing.

Saturday, May 6th, will be an Open Day until 7:00 P.M. when there will be a Cocktail Party, (Cash Bar), Dinner will be at 8:00 P.M. and there will be a combo that will play during dinner. After dinner there will be professional Entertainment, then Dancing until 12:00 P.M.

The big program for the 50th Anniversary of "VE DAY" will take place at the Cambridge American Cemetery on Sunday, May 7th. This program is being planned by Mr. Heath from the U.S. State Department and it is still in the planning stages and it is too early to know who the key player will be. We are hoping it will be a similar program to the "D DAY" celebration, which was held in this same location. In attendance for the "D DAY" affair were President Bill Clinton, Prime Minister John Majors, Secretary of the Treasury, the Honorable Lloyd Bentsen, and Walter Cronkite. We will have lunch in Cambridge following this affair. After lunch

we will go to the Duxford Air Museum. Sunday evening will be free.

The actual date for the 50th Anniversary of "VE DAY" is Monday, May 8th, We will have our program at the Memorial Monument, Grafton Underwood. This will take place from 11:00 A.M. to 12:00 Noon. After the Ceremony we will have lunch in either Boughton House or in Grafton Underwood, Memorial Junket VIII will end on Monday evening with our traditional "GALA FAREWELL DINNER DANCE." This will start at 6:00 P.M. with a Host Cocktail Party. Dinner will be at 7:00 P.M. and Dancing to a Big Band until midnight.

There is a Deadline Date of February 24th, 1995. We are aware that this doesn't give you much time to make your decision about attending, but the deadline is necessary for the following reasons. May 6th thru May 8th is a special weekend in Great Britain and because of this there is a big demand for hotel rooms. Since we got our bid in early, we were able to reserve 75 rooms with an option for 25 additional rooms, IF, and this is a BIG IF, the Hotel Room Reservation are received by the Leicester Holiday Inn by February 24th, 1995. To assure everyone gets a hotel room and to expedite the Hotel Room Reservation, we will make them for you.

Included with this Newsletter are three Forms, a Memorial Junket VIII Registration Form, a Leicester Holiday Inn Hotel Room Reservation Form, and a Memorial Junket VIII Table Seating Reservation Form. The Memorial Junket VIII Registration Form and Deposit and the Leicester Holiday Inn Hotel Room Reservation Form are to be mailed to Ted Rothschild. The Memorial Junket VIII Table Seating Reservation Form is to be mailed to Lloyd Whitlow. The following information is needed on the Leicester Holiday Inn Hotel Room Reservation Form: Name, Address, Telephone Number, Number of People in your party, Date of Arrival, Date of Departure. Smoking or Non-Smoking Hotel Room, Type of Credit Card, Number and Date of Expiration, ie: Mastercard, Visa, American Express, if other Type of Credit Card . . . specify. If you do not have a Credit Card, then include a Deposit of \$100.00. If for some reason it becomes necessary to cancel your Hotel Room Reservation, make your cancellation directly with the Leicester Holiday Inn by telephoning: 011-44-116-251-1161.

We were very fortunate in receiving the same Hotel









Room Rate that we have had for the last two Memorial Junkets: £43.00 Single Occupancy, £55.00 Double Occupancy, £60.00 Triple Occupancy, and £65.00

Quadruple Occupancy.

AGAIN, make your Hotel Room Reservations at the Leicester Holiday Inn by filling out the enclosed Leicester Holiday Inn Hotel Room Reservation Form and mail this Form to Ted Rothschild. **DO NOT**, and we repeat, **DO NOT** make your Hotel Room Reservation for the Leicester Holiday Inn by telephoning their "800" telephone number, this will only complicate things and we cannot guarantee that you will receive a Hotel Room. If you fill out and return the enclosed Leicester Holiday Inn Hotel Room Reservation Form to Ted Rothschild by February 24th, 1995, we will guarantee that you will receive a Hotel Room.

Also please fill out and return the Memorial Junket VIII Registration Form, along with a deposit of \$70.00 per person. Mail this Form and the Hotel Room Reservation Form to Ted Rothschild. Both Forms must be received by Ted no later than February 24th, 1995. The full price for Memorial Junket VIII will be £160.00. This price does not include your

Hotel Room.

You will note that most of the prices are quoted in British Pounds Stirling. This is necessary because of the daily fluctuation of the Exchange Rate. Your deposit of \$70.00 per person will be adjusted at Registration with the Exchange Rate for that day.

REMEMBER that you must make your own travel arrangements and accommodations other than the Leicester Holiday Inn. There are a lot of bargain AirFares available. Check this out with your Travel Agent, or by calling various Airlines. If you plan to rent a car, the best bargain is with Hertz, if you prepay. At the present time, no other car rental agencies

are offering pre-payment.

There will be assigned table seating for both the Saturday and the Monday evening dinners at the Leicester Holiday Inn. If you desire a Group Table, fill out and return the enclosed Memorial Junket VIII Table Seating Reservation Form, mail this Form to Lloyd Whitlow. The tables will seat twelve people and the tables will be assigned on a FIRST COME BASIS. We will use the date that the Memorial Junket VIII Table Seating Reservation Form is received, and/or the Memorial Junket VIII Registration Form. The sooner we receive either of these Forms, the better table you will be assigned.

There will be NO NAME TAGS made for Memorial Junket VIII. Most of our members have a drawer full of Name Tags, so PLEASE bring one of these Name Tags with you, any shape, color, or size. If you do not have a Name Tag, contact Lloyd Whitlow and he will

have one made for you.

With the Banks in England being closed on Saturday, Sunday, and Monday there will be no banks open during this three day holiday to exchange your dollars to pounds. HOWEVER, the General Manager, John Evans, of the Leicester Holiday Inn has made arrangements to have money available at the Hotel and they will exchange your U.S. Dollars at the Bank Rates.

As has been required during past Memorial Junkets, we CANNOT accept Personal Checks at Regis-

tration. You will be required to pay the Balance Due with either U.S. Dollars or British Pounds Stirling. We will also accept Travelers Checks in either denomination.

REMEMBER THAT THE DEADLINE IS FEBRU-ARY 24TH, 1995 . . . after that date we cannot guarantee that you will receive a Hotel Room Reser-

vation at the Leicester Holiday Inn.







BEHIND THE WIRE

The air war between the Allies and Nazi Germany was the longest and most catastrophic of the Second World War. Over 150,000 Allied airmen were to lose their lives. Nearly 47,000 were captured and went 'behind the wire.' Yet another 6,000 who were shot down managed to hide out and evade capture.

Never revealed or presented are the various outrages committed against Allied airmen, the untold story of the 'Great Escape,' the 'Heydekrug Run' and the forced marches as the Third Reich was crumbling.

This is a story of courage and cruelty, suffering and hope. It is presented in a mix of captured German film, air combat footage, illustrations and the airmen themselves, shown as they were then and now.







FRED NOWOSAD August 7, 1915 - October 4, 1994

The 384th Bomb Group recently lost one of its dearest and most loyal members. Fred Nowosad passed away on October 4th, after a long battle with a kidney ailment. Fritz, as his friends affectionately called him, took pride in the fact that he was among the first to join the 384th in wartime and one of the last to leave it at the end of the war.

In war and in peace he served the 384th, giving it his most dedicated attention and devotion. As Engineering Officer of the 545th Squadron, he regarded the aircraft almost as human - he wanted his planes to take good care of the crews flying to and from the designated targets. He saw to it that the crew chiefs he supervised were as meticulous as he was, and when one of his planes had to abort for a mechanical failure not due to improper maintenance, it was as though he himself had suffered a wound. One time when he was threatened with an investigation because the landing gear of a B-17 had retracted while being worked on at the hard stand, Fritz proved to the visiting "brass" that the original wiring had been faulty by showing them the wiring diagram.

After the war when the 384th became incorporated, Fritz was appointed Treasurer after the second reunion, a position he held until he left us. It always bothered him that not enough members wanted to inspect the books to verify correctness; his reputation for precision and honesty preceded him. Later on, he also assumed the position of Secretary, and likewise carried out his obligations impeccably. For all his hard work, the Group always extended their sincere thanks. Fritz remained permanent Secretary-Treasurer and, along with the rest of the Board, never received remuneration or repayment for his travel

expenses.

Fritz gave his dedication to perfection and his devotion to his work to the 384th. His great affection for the Group, as well as his good-natured humor, will be remembered by all of us who knew him. He will be missed!

Another members who will be greatly missed is "Al Hesko," a very active member and a member of our Board of Directors. All of us who worked with "AL" in the working of the 384th Bomb Group will really miss him.

Our sincere condolences to his lovely wife Lynn.
