
Enclosed in this newsletter are many pages of photographs of our reunion - If your picture isn't here - you did not send us any.

My crew and I were delighted to perform the Memorial Flypast for the veterans of the 384th Bomb Group. The weapons and tactics of war may change, but the bravery of you and other veterans stands as a legacy for those of us that follow in military service. Our own limited experience in combat cannot compare to the harrowing flights from Grafton Underwood but hopefully our efforts, like yours before us, promote the cause of freedom.

My only regret is that we were not able to fly at our combat training altitude of 300 feet about ground level. I have just returned from planning a flight at that altitude for a paratroop airdrop in Kosova (I flew as the C-130 liaison on a NATO Airborne Early Warning aircraft). Sadly, one paratrooper was killed from a chute malfunction, but hopefully the operation served to warn present day antagonists away from war.

I look forward to meeting you and other 384th Bomb Group members some day. At present our high operations tempo (current jargon for flying the wings off the planes) keeps us gainfully employed far from home, but there is always the chance that I'll get a short notice trip to Vegas someday.

Ed Zieba who passed away at the beginning of the Junket will be cremated and his ashes returned home. Memorial service will be held the 17th in England.

It was announced that Bob Coleman is seriously ill. The Board voted to make him Member Emeritus.

Suggested replacement for Coleman was Gene Voiland. Moved, seconded, carried unanimously.

Bland was asked to leave the room briefly. It was suggested that Bland should have a fax machine to help with his coordination work with the 384th. Harvey

made the motion, Thompson seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Year 2000 reunion would be near Savannah, GA in September. Various hotels will be investigated, Hilton Head was suggested.

A financial report was distributed and briefly discussed. It was reported that we still owe the Savannah Museum \$25,000 to place our window in the new chapel, and the bottom line is not the true picture as we still have other obligations. It was suggested that members consider naming the 384th in their will. Harvey suggested making a miniature monument to be sold as a moneymaker. The board thought it was an excellent idea. Rothschild will investigate the feasibility

Report on Hill Air Force Base Museum made by Mazer:

A new 45,000 S.F. building has recently been built at the base and two expeditions to the Aleutians to recover a B-24 and a P-38 have been made since the last meeting.

The P-38 is on display at the museum, but the B-24 won't be ready until next year. There has been an average of 200,000 visitors per year, 405 being foreigners. Another 45,000 S.F. hanger is being built. A cargo aircraft hanger is in the planning stage. Our bell is sounded each day in the W.W.II Chapel. Our monument is coming to the chapel shortly, and the original bulletin board has been refurbished and installed.

West of the Mississippi, Hill Museum is second in the nation to the museum at Boeing. The history of the 384th Bomb Group is presented on the Bulletin Board adjacent to the B-17. There probably will be a "Gathering" at Ogden in May, 2000 to dedicate all new 384th contributions.

All actions of the 384th are discussed and voted on at board meetings by the Board of Directors, while many things must be acted upon when the opportunity is presented.

Mazer made a motion to make Shirley Haskell, whose brother was killed while serving with the 384th an honorary member of the 384th; Harvey seconded the motion, which carried unanimously. Voiland volunteered to make a certificate denoting Honorary Membership.

Miscellaneous: 17 members have been lost since the first of the year, some thought given to accepting family heirs as members. Board of Directors meeting may be held February or March, 2000. Harvey suggested a memorial for Ed Zieba since he was an ex-Board member. No action taken.

Motion to close made by Mazer, seconded by Harvey, passed unanimously. Meeting closed at 11:45 A.M.
