

Neal B. Dillon has written a book entitled, *A DYING BREED*, . . . The Courage of the Mighty Eighth Air Force. Neal's brother-in-law, Technical Sergeant John Honeycutt, was a member of the 384th Bomb Group and served as an engineer/top turret gunner prior to being shot down on his 17th mission to Kiel, Germany on January 4, 1944.

In 1991, John prevailed upon the author to write a book about his crew and bomb group so that others may learn from the sacrifices and hardships they endured. The book is dedicated to John, his crewmates and to all members of the 384th Bomb Group who served during WWII. With the publication of this book comes a fulfillment of a promise that the author made to his brother-in-law before his death in 1992 . . . a promise to tell the story of the men he flew with; a tale of courage, camaraderie, faith and spirit.

#### 384th Bomb Group, Inc. Membership Meeting Sept. 2, 2000 - 9:00 A.M. Savannah, GA

Reunion President, Don Thompson, opened the meeting with a poem.

Prayer was offered, lead by Chaplain, Palazzo,

followed by the pledge of allegiance.

Lloyd Whitlow opened with words of welcome, especially to those who were attending for the first time.

Roll call of 17th reunion officers. Absent were: Nilo, Goebel, Majesky, McCormack, Beese, and Bardue.

Roll call of Board of Directors. Present: Whitlow, Rothschild, Mazer, Harvey, Kaessner, Thompson, Voiland, Barnes, Turner, Guilmet.

Absent: Arauz, Carnes.

Minutes of Board of Directors Meeting of May 10, 2000 were read by Kaessner. Financial report was read by Rothschild, Bank balance is \$28,000. Group owes the museum \$15,000 for the window placement.

Old Business: Rothschild reported that the 8th AF Museum Chapel is delayed 1 year due to cost overrun. A concept of the window was shown. Window has been changed to accommodate the architecture of the chapel.

The video which was sent to all members and which a donation was suggested, cleared \$600.

Quentin Bland thanked the 384th for bringing he and Barbara to the meeting. He reported on activities in Grafton Underwood. Many visitors from around the country come to see the window and the memorial. The bell is run in Kettering and Grafton Underwood on July 4th. Bland shows movies of the 384th every 6 weeks. Northampton has set up a trust to build a museum and has accumulated 3000 pounds. He reported on Annie Bagshaw and the history of her care of the monument. He stated that Annie is 93 years old and not too spry. Quentin takes the vase to her and after she places flowers in it he takes her to the monument.

Hill AF Base: Mazer reported on activities at Hill. Video of the Museum was shown. Some 200,000 visitors annually see the 384th exhibits at Hill. The stained glass window is a major tourist attraction. The bell is sounded on the 4th of July at the same time bells are sounded all across the country. The second hanger is finished and has 16 fighters. The "Triangle P" is in good hands. 20 bomber groups trained at Wendover, UT and 16 were in the 8th AF.

Nate was thanked for his tireless efforts at Hill AF Base.

Harvey explained the 5,000 pound piece of White Cliff of Dover and new idea for a memorial monument.

Word re. Father Billy from Palazzo and disposition of his artifacts. Chief Chaplain of the US Airforce was contacted who suggested that all Fr. Billy's things be sent to Maxwell AF Base where all Catholic Chaplains train. A nice picture of the stained glass window be sent also. It was moved, seconded and carried unanimously. Rothschild to handle.

Member White, had a few words on Chelation. It was suggested that he present an article for the newsletter, which he agreed to.

New Business: Acceptance of Associate members was discussed. 17 members have died since 1st of the year. An Associate is either a relative or interested person. Will be defined, later. Biera spoke in favor. Organizations are folding because of lack of personnel to carry on. Moved to investigate matter. Himmelstein made motion, Biera 2nd to form a study committee, carried unanimously.

Mazer stated that the 8th AF Historical group

will be going to Ogden next Oct.

Suggested that 384th go in May 2001 and would stay in the new Marriott Hotel. It would be a 2 day program which would include the Promontory Point ceremony. It could be called "A Gathering" and would be open to everyone.

Election of 18th reunion officers. Harvey selected a board for nominating committee.

Reunion officers were elected as usual. Gene Voiland will be president.

Location of 2002 reunion. San Diego, Las Vegas and Sacramento were suggested as locations for the next reunion. San Diego was the winner for the 2002 reunion.

Good of the Order. Mr. Dillon described contents of his latest book (Gilrane was waist gunner), "Dying Breed."

Marc Poole presented his desire to present a program on the internet, (marcpoole.com) covering aspects of the 384th BG. Motion to cooperate working with him. Moved, 2nd, carried unanimously.

A bill in Washington to charge for E-mail.


Voiland commented on meeting with Annie Bagshaw.

Sam Arauz's wife Blanche passed away on 7-26-2000.


