Will you meet us in D.C. for the 2022 384th Bomb Group reunion?

We'll join the 8th Air Force Historical Society this October in our nation's capital

As we did in 2011, 2016 and 2017, our 384th reunion will be held 19-23 October this year in conjunction with the 8th Air Force Historical Society gathering. The 2022 reunion brings us to the nation's capital, a city with much to offer 384th

members who are able to participate.

Among the highlights of the five-day event in Washington, D.C. will be a tour of the Smithsonian's Steven F. Udvar-Hazy museum annex at Washington Dulles International Airport. Among its exhibits are the Space Shuttle *Discovery*, the B-29 that dropped the first atom bomb, the *Enola Gay*, and the Gemini 7 space capsule (see picture, below left).

Other tours will visit Arlington National Cemetery and the many monuments on the National Mall, including the World War II memorial (see picture at right).

Our 2021 reunion took us "home" to the roots of the 384th to see our signed wing panel and Col. Nathan H.

Mazer Memorial Chapel at Hill Air Force Base, and the museum at the former Wendover Army Air Field in Utah.



In 2023, we plan on a U.K. junket and a return to Grafton Underwood, where we expect to see quite a difference in the clearing and preparation for the museum that the Friends of the 384th are shepherding to completion over the next few years.

In addition to the many 8th AFHS events, please remember to sign up for the Friday night (21 October) Rendezvous Dinner, so that we can KEEP THE SHOW ON THE ROAD in a separate space, which will be provided if we have enough 384th registrants (we need at least 20).

TAPS August 2022

We do our best to keep everyone updated when a 384th veteran flies west. Here are the latest obituaries, as of August 2022.

S. Sgt. Leonard "Len" Estrin, ball turret gunner, 546th squadron, 17 missions (2 March-19 April 1945). Died 28 June 2022, aged 97. In addition to his wartime service with the 384th, Len was a longtime leader in our association and a frequent attendee at reunions and junkets, usually with his wife Helen. The picture at right is of Len and Helen with Sally B at Duxford during our September 2019 junket to England.

Most recently, Len served as a senior vice president on the 384th Bomb Group board.

Firsts, lasts and notables, a select history of 384th aircraft on the website

The 384th Bomb Group website is a fantastic public resource for those affiliated with or interested in the bomb group, and the dedicated volunteers who built and maintain it provide plenty of great content for our newsletter. This month, thanks to Fred Preller, we feature images (and short histories) of a few of the notable B-17s that flew with the group during its time at Grafton Underwood. We hope you enjoy – and check out the comprehensive aircraft histories on the website!

Technically the oldest (and thus first?) B-17 in the 384th inventory was 41-9022, Alabama Exterminator II, the group's

only B-17E, which was assigned to exactly one mission (which it did not complete) before becoming the group's weather and utility plane (see picture, right).


Alabama Exterminator came to the group from the 92nd Bomb Group in June 1943 and served with the 384th until being transferred to the Base Air Depot 1 at Burtonwood in July 1944.

What happened to *Alabama Exterminator* after that transfer is unclear.

By far one of the best-known B-17s in the 384th was a "last," not a first. The Spotted Cow, formerly Patches II (42-3441), was

the last B-17F to fly a combat mission with the 384th. It arrived at the 547th Squadron on 9 August 1943, flying its first mission on 15 August to Amiens, France (see picture below).

Patches II completed 39 combat missions until 16 June 1944, after which it became a spare until declared "War Weary" on the 6 August 1944 aircraft inventory.



From 19 June 1944 it was relegated to weather and formation assembly duty. It actually survived the war, remaining on the 384th inventory until 6 June 1945. Following its service, it was returned to the U.S. and scrapped.

It's uncertain if 384th mission planners knew that mission #316 on 25 April 1945 would be the group's last, so the honor of leading that trek to the Skoda works in Czechoslovakia fell to a unnamed Vega-built B-17G of the 545th squadron, 44-8789, a plane that is credited with 11

missions, nearly all of them as a squadron or group lead as it was a PFF (Pathfinder Force) ship (see picture, below).

On the group's final mission, the aircraft commander and group leader was Maj. Dale Hutchinson, who frequently flew as a squadron or group lead.



However, this was the only mission he flew in this particular aircraft, according to group records. This B-17 survived the war and was scrapped in 1947.

Here's one of the few pictures we have of 44-8789 on the website that clearly shows its PFF radome that held its target-seeking radar, which replaced the ball turret on PFF ships.

Grafton Underwood past and present map becomes a museum piece!

Thanks to the 384th Bomb Group leadership, Mel Hubbard's past and present map of Grafton Underwood has been accepted by the Eighth Air Force Museum in Pooler, Ga.

In a letter to Frank Alfter, our president, Vivian Rogers-Price, Ph.D., director of the Roger A. Freeman Eighth Air Force Research Center, wrote that the map has been accepted as the Melanie Hubbard Collection.


The map "is a treasured addition to this museum's research center," Rogers-Price wrote.

The group is paying to have the map appropriately framed so that it may be properly displayed.

In our June 2022 edition we shared a much larger (and better) version of the map and more about its creation. "My husband Roger and I have no links to the 'Forces' but have lived in Grafton for almost 17 years now and our interest has grown from the place, the history and the people around us. We 'hosted' Rosie McNair for the 2019 reunion, having made contact with her through Matt Smith and Neill Howarth," Mel said then.

As of our June 2022 newsletter Mel had been able to donate £150 towards the museum project (see below).

Mel has also completed a map of Geddington, where 384th personnel frequented the pubs in their down time. Mel will also donate £10 from the sale of each Geddington map to the 384th Bomb group museum project. Work continues on site of 384th museum at Grafton Underwood as fundraising grows

In our June 2022 issue, we reported on the success of the U.S. fundraising effort for the museum that the Friends of the 384th



Underwood home. To date, our initial \$30,000 fundraising goal has been surpassed with donations and pledges of more than \$31,000 recorded.

Meanwhile, planning for the museum and clearing of the site continues with a dedicated corps of volunteers. Thanks to their work, the Operations Building that will be at the core of the planned museum complex has been cleared and secured for eventual restoration into a proper home for the U.K. history of the 384th Bomb Group. As has been the case seemingly around the world, heat and drought have been challenges for the volunteers but they have pressed on. To donate to the museum effort, see the box on page 6 for details.

Here's a recent photo of the progress volunteers are making inside the Ops Building. Note that cleaning is well underway, though graffiti from the years since

the war is still be tackled. In recent weeks, the volunteers have focused on exterior clearing as well, despite the summer heat.
